Neighbourhood Outcomes	2,050 Manton residents engaged at some level in MCA to Sept 07 % male and % female engaged ? green engagement – highly engaged

## Summary

Through Manton Community Alliance, a Neighbourhood Management Pathfinder, the neighbourhood policing agenda in Manton is 18 months ahead of the Home Office Target date and is now being used as a model for rolling out Neighbourhood Policing (Safer Neighbourhoods in Notts) across the Policing District.
